Musings from the Chair



I like tradition. There is comfort there, some predictability that soothes my soul. When a tradition needs to change (like not having Christmas dinner at my sister's house), my natural tendency is to resist. Being willing to change up the way things are done or the way I expect them to be sometimes takes my breath away. But over the years, being married to a man of a different culture, having a son with ideas of his own and gaining wisdom through experience, I have learned to adapt and actually enjoy the changes.

Having been a member of the guild for 24 years, I have seen some changes over the years. Interestingly, most changes have not been all that significant in the big scheme of things. Board and committee members come and go and our venue has had to re-locate a couple of times. Our bylaws, which guide how we conduct our business, and our policies, which outline the specifics, are reviewed and updated to provide greater clarification for our members.

The emergence of Covid required the guild to make huge changes, and I will be eternally grateful to those on the Board at that time who were willing to take a huge risk by having us meet electronically over Zoom. Will I ever get used to seeing myself on camera? Likely not! I have heard of some guilds who didn't make that leap and now have a flagging membership and the likelihood of dissolving. Our guild membership numbers have remained strong and we have an active core of people who are strong supporters of and advocates for the EDQG. Zoom has had an unexpected effect though: when we were able to gather again, many members chose to stay at home and participate in the guild meetings participate via Zoom. What a wonderful option for those who don't like to drive in the evening, especially on icy roads, or for those who prefer the comfort of their own space! Standing at the front of the meeting room to chair a hybrid meeting, I confess that I felt sad that I couldn't see everyone on the screen and feel the energy that only in-person encounters can bring. I have worried that some of our members might feel isolated without the in-person contact that has bound the guild together.

I can see that changes in the guild are inevitable. We now have the technology to renew memberships, register for events, enter quilts into shows and meet with each other without getting off our sofas! It raises some interesting questions for the Board: how do we encourage people to participate, to get the most out of their membership, if they never have to leave home? How will new members get to know people in the guild? How do we ensure that we are meeting the needs of our members?

As I leave my term as Chair, I want to remind you that the guild is YOU! Your leadership team merely works on your behalf. What the Board needs is your feedback and input. Please speak up, if you like something or if you don't. Otherwise, we run the risk of missing what may be really important to YOU!

I am extremely grateful to have been able to work on your behalf for the past two years. We have a phenomenal group of leaders in our Executive members, our Directors and our Committee Chairs. We have a dedicated collection of committee members who put their heart and soul into activities for the guild. And we have our members, who participate as they are able and love to know who the next guest speaker will be. As a group of individuals who collectively enjoy cutting up fabric and sewing it back together, we ROCK! From the bottom of my heart, thank you, thank you, thank you!

Community Service, cont'd The EDQG charity quilt volunteers create such beautiful quilts for others. We, the Society of St Vincent de Paul, thank you and appreciate your donations and the ongoing support so we can collaboratively serve those in need both locally and in the Arctic.

Just this week we had a call from a single mother of three boys, age 2, 3 and 4, who has very little and is setting up an apartment. They will be the recipients of furniture, household necessities and some of your quilts. Many mattresses and a couple boxes of your last beautiful quilt and receiving blanket donations are on their 4-month journey, via road, river and ocean to Ulukhaktok.

Could we request twin, double or queen bed size quilts? Knowing that it is so much more work to create but when we deliver mattresses and beds, we always accompany each delivery with a set of sheets, blanket or quilt, pillows and pillowcases. We have many clients who have been sleeping on the floor or a mat, so a bed is often requested.

I think of all you have provided with comfort and joy by the works of your hands. Thanks again Edmonton and District Quilt Guild.
